Australia is the only country that is also a continent. Australia is the smallest continent in the world and the sixth-largest country. It lies in the Southern Hemisphere (polokoule) between the Pacific Ocean and the Indian Ocean. Because

of the position, the seasons are opposite to seasons in the Northern Hemisphere. The country is also called "the land down under" because it is situated south off the equator (rovník). The country is also called the Oz and the Australians sometimes call themselves Aussies. The capital of Australia is Canberra but the largest city is Sydney. Australia has no official language but most people speak Australian English. There are also other languages such as Mandarin, Italian, Greek, Vietnamese and some Aboriginal languages still exist even now. Australia has six states—New South Wales (NSW), Queensland (QLD), South Australia (SA), Tasmania (TAS), Victoria (VIC) and Western Australia (WA)—and two territories—the Australian Capital Territory (ACT) and the Northern Territory (NT). Australia is a constitutional monarchy and so the English Queen is the official head of state but she has no powers. She is represented by the Governor-General. The first people who came to Australia about 40,000 years ago were the Aborigines. They lived mainly in the outback (Australské vnitrozemí) which is a dry part of Australia. Most Australians liv along the coast in large cities.

The main currency that is used in Australia is Australian dollar. Like in Britain, the people drive on the left.

Interesting facts about Australia

Short history

First people came to Australia from Indonesia and they travelled on boats. It was about 40,000 years ago and they are called the Aborigines. In 1770 British Captain James Cook came to New South Wales and Australia became a British colony. The British started to send English

criminals there and they made it a British prison colony. In 1901 Australia became a free nation but

Uluru

the outback (Australské vnitrozemí). On top of the rock there are valleys, caves (jeskyně) and strange shapes. It was a sacred



(svaté) place for the Aboriginal people.

is the world's largest coral reef system (systém korálových útesů). You can see it from the space and it is over 2,000 km long and it has got


more than 900 islands. There are many different types of corals, fish and other sea animals.

Australian Wildlife

Australia has the most unusual assortment of animals and plants on Earth. Almost half of the world's population of marsupials are found only in Australia. Marsupials include koalas, kangaroos, wombats, possums, and bandicoots.

The landscape in Australia is very varied. There are more deserts in Australia than any other continent.

Sometimes there is no rainfall in these areas for several years. More than half of Australia is covered by desert and many poisonous animals can be found there.

Funnel web spiders are large and hairy. They are called this because they build funnel-shaped webs to catch their prey. Their bite is extremely poisonous.

Kangaroos have strong back legs and huge tails. There are around 50 different kinds of kangaroo in Australia, the red kangaroo is one of the largest and can grow to over 2 m in height.

Smaller members of the kangaroo family are called wallabies. The rednecked wallaby is also called the brusher because it prefers brush and scrubland areas rather than open countryside.

There are more than 2,000 wildlife reserves and national parks in Australia, which cover 80 million hectares (197 million acres).
